- **Responsive to evolving labor market needs.**



EU ALMPO History & Context (2/2)



Key Developments leading to EU-ALMPO:

- **Recognition of gaps** in existing ALMP frameworks, including issues with skill mismatches and the employability of vulnerable groups.
- Advances in **AI-driven data analysis** and real-time labor market monitoring, enabling a more proactive approach.
- Growing demand for **stakeholder engagement** and participative policy design to improve policy relevance and acceptance.
- Successful pilots and studies conducted in various EU countries, demonstrating the need for a **centralized EU ALMP Observatory**.



EU ALMPO Outline



Overview

The EU-ALMPO project establishes the **EU Active Labor Market Policies (ALMP) Observatory**, an innovative entity designed to reshape the approach to Active Labor Market Policies across the European Union. It seeks to address key deficiencies in policy formulation, implementation, and evaluation, offering comprehensive support to policymakers.

Main Focus

1. **Centralized ALMP Observatory:** Develop a central hub for data-driven policy insights, leveraging a sophisticated IT platform with AI-driven analytical tools.
2. **Policy Innovation & Evaluation:** Improve the design, implementation, and monitoring of ALMPs through advanced methodologies and tools, ensuring more inclusive and targeted labor market policies.
3. **Skills Development & Matching:** Promote effective skills matching and lifelong learning opportunities to bridge labor market gaps and support workforce adaptability.
4. **Support for Vulnerable Groups:** Focus on enhancing the employability of disadvantaged and vulnerable groups through tailored interventions and innovative policy solutions.



EU ALMPO Target Groups



1. Policymakers at the EU, national, regional and sectoral levels – engaged in labour market and VET policies

2. PES and guidance practitioners

3. Individuals mainly Low skilled and vulnerable groups seeking support in the labour market

4. Labour market actors (Employers, employees and their representatives)

5. Research community focusing on labour market and educational policy research



EU ALMPO Expected Impact



1.Enhanced ALMP Outcomes: More effective, data-driven labor market policies across EU member states, resulting in optimized policy targeting, skill development, and labor market integration.

2.Informed Policymaking: A proactive framework that provides policymakers with actionable insights through advanced data-driven analytics and real-time monitoring tools, enabling anticipation of future labor market trends and challenges.

3.Sustainable Employment: Support for upskilling and reskilling initiatives, leading to long-term labor market participation and improved workforce adaptability.

Ambition: Revolutionize the *design, evaluation, and implementation* of ALMPs by addressing gaps, improving skill matching, and enhancing labor market integration for diverse groups, including vulnerable populations.

Enhance policy development, implementation, and evaluation.

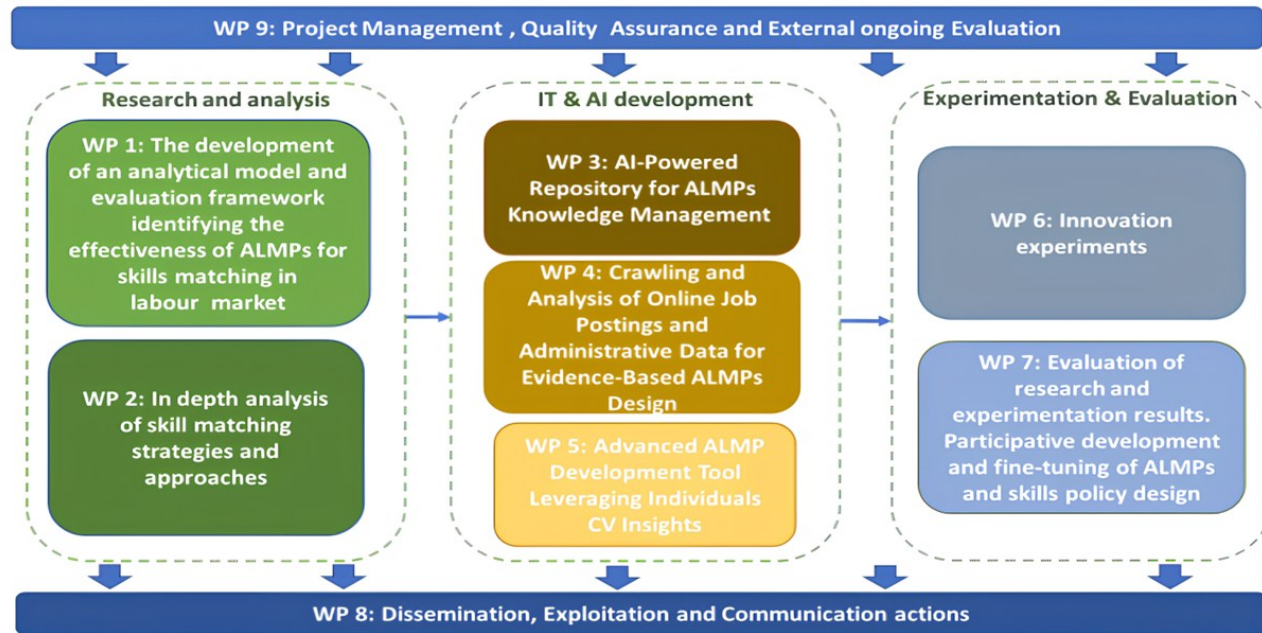
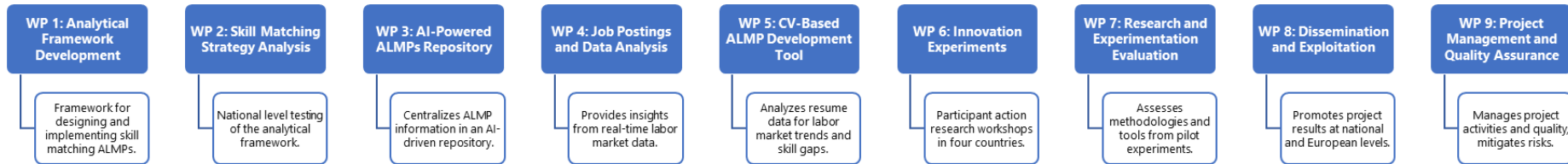
 **Framework Development** Establish a comprehensive framework to aid policymakers in the development, implementation, and scrutiny of ALMPs.
